Minutes from the May meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Vicky Muma

There are 105 members, 54 Azalea and 51 Burden. There are 2 new members, Mary Bray and Judy Pauletich. There is \$5797.14 (not including the new member dues). There was a \$280 payout for ham and egg and Past presidents tournament. This does not include all of the amount due for the past president tournament as not all bills have come in. A complete breakdown will be at the end of the minutes.

Upcoming Events: Karen Wirth

Ham and Egg. There are 56 participants, with even teams at this time.

Play with the Pro: Currently we only have 4 possible pros. It was motioned, seconded and voted affirmative to place this event on hold until another pro is available. It will be revisited if we get another pro soon.

Scoring: Kim Crounse

The scoring committee has noticed a decline in the compliance with the requirements of play days. During the past two months we have seen/continue to see issues. Please make sure you:

- Write the name of attester on the card and birdie/chip in slips (signature not required)
- Only put an 'X' on the card when a player picks up on/does not play a hole
- If you are doing the math long hand on the card, do it on the opposite side of the card so that the gross scores and handicap are readable
- Complete the card and put it in the locker room box immediately after completing the round, not after a visit to the patio or Mulligans
- Post your score in GHIN immediately upon returning home
- Use the hole by hole entry option in GHIN if you are not confident in determining your max for a hole

Several years ago, when we went to using spreadsheets to assist in the scoring, a thorough review of LGA play day rules was completed. The overwhelming majority of rules were eliminated, significantly reducing the number of weekly disqualifications and increasing the fun. Many of the rules that were eliminated had been put in place as a result of players repeatedly making errors related to the cards which considerably slowed down the activity of scoring. The recent decline in compliance has been slowing down the process of scoring. The members of the committee put in a lot of time doing their tasks. We ask that you do your part to make our jobs as easy as possible.

If a tournament has a "name" such as ham and egg, member member, you can play both LGA play day and the tournament. (you can not play both on the same day). If it is a shotgun, you can not play both the shotgun and the LGA game.

Gwen will send out the local rules to the LGA reporter. She encourages you to print them and keep them for easy review.

When a hole doesn't count on an LGA day, ALL rules of golf apply except putting out. If you don't putt out, place an x on the hole so it will not count as a ringer.

It was questioned that if your ball is in a washout, is it a free drop if the area is not marked GUR and all players agree it is a washout. The answer is NO, you must play as it lies or take a penalty drop. This may be addressed as a possible local rule at future board meetings.

The May 15th shotgun had 56 golfers and 60 for lunch, including 8 past presidents. 2 members chose to have their lunch to go.

Moving forward, there will be a served buffet for the next 3 shotguns. There will also be 8 tops so that foursomes can sit together.
